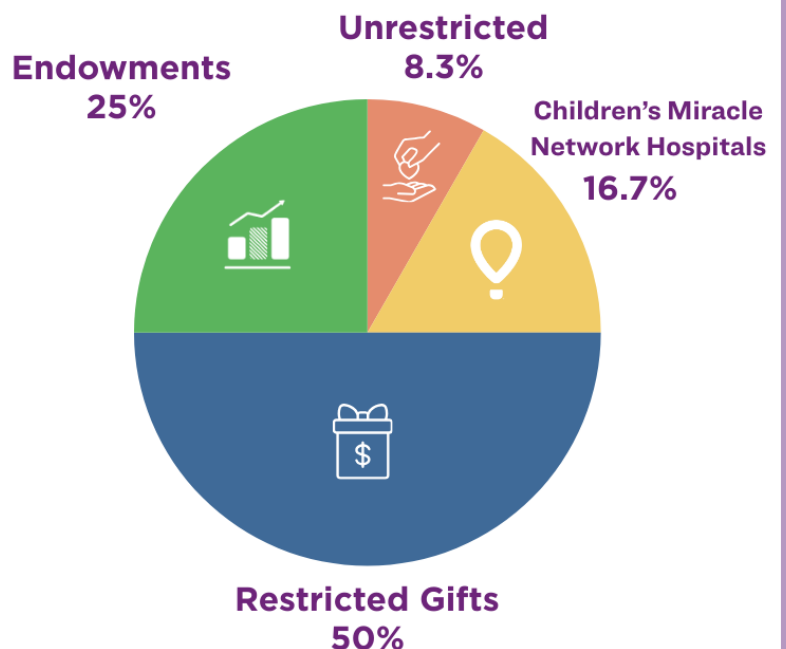

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Moody Foundation's \$1 Million Gift Expands Life-saving Maternal and Fetal Care at CHRISTUS Children's

CHRISTUS Children's is expanding life-saving maternal and fetal care programs thanks to a \$1 million grant from the Moody Foundation. The gift supports the growth of the Maternal Fetal Medicine Clinic, the Fetal Care Center and the Perinatal Mental Health Clinic.



Texas faces some of the highest maternal health risks in the country. This investment will nearly triple the clinic's size, increase ultrasound capacity, and establish San Antonio's first dedicated Fetal Care Center.

The grant also embeds mental health providers within the clinic, ensuring timely support for expectant and postpartum women, addressing a leading contributor to maternal mortality. With expanded services, the clinic will boost patient capacity by 20%, extend outreach to underserved

communities and triple maternal transfer admissions by 2027. Upon completion, the expanded facility will be named the Moody Center for Maternal and Fetal Medicine, honoring the Moody Foundation's commitment to empowering Texas communities to thrive and prosper.

CHRISTUS Children's Heart Center Expands with New Pediatric Cardiac Operating Center

CHRISTUS Children's Heart Center is launching a new pediatric cardiac surgery operating center, thanks to a transformative \$2.74 million grant from the CHRISTUS Children's Foundation. The lead gift of \$1.5 million comes from The Max and Minnie Tomerlin Voelcker Fund, which has contributed over \$7.9 million in the past decade.



The grant will support advanced surgical technology, including live-streaming capabilities, ECMO equipment and an expanded operating room, doubling its current size to 850 square feet. Completion is expected in 2026.

"This generous support helps us continue delivering exceptional outcomes for our youngest patients," said Dr. Victor Bautista-Hernandez, pediatric cardiac surgeon.

Congenital heart defects remain the leading cause of birth defect-related illness and death in infants. With community support, CHRISTUS Children's continues to transform lives, one heartbeat at a time.

\$2 Million Gift Expands Pediatric Emergency Care Across South Texas

The Kate Marmion Charitable Foundation has awarded a \$2 million grant to CHRISTUS Children's Foundation, launching South Texas's first Pediatric Emergency Medicine (PEM) Fellowship Program and a rural outreach initiative to improve access to emergency care. Led by Dr. Larry Quang, the program will begin training fellows in July 2026, growing to six fellows by 2028.



The fellowship program aims to address the shortage of pediatric emergency specialists in rural areas, where only 10% of physicians serve 20% of the population. The grant also supports partnerships with rural hospitals across Central, South and West Texas, offering telemedicine consultations, continuing education and rapid transport coordination for critically ill children.

“This gift will reshape pediatric emergency care across Texas,” said Dr. Ian Thompson, Jr., president of CHRISTUS Children’s Foundation. “No matter where families live, high-quality care will be within reach.”

The Malú and Carlos Alvarez Family’s \$2.5 Million Gift Advances Craniofacial and Orthopedic Surgery at CHRISTUS Children’s

CHRISTUS Children’s has received a \$2.5 million gift from the Malú and Carlos Alvarez family to expand access to advanced craniofacial and orthopedic surgery for children across South Texas.



The donation will fund a full renovation of two specialized operating rooms, featuring cutting-edge surgical systems, real-time monitoring and a redesigned layout to support complex craniofacial and orthopedic procedures.

“We are deeply grateful to the Alvarez family for their vision and commitment to transforming lives through surgical innovation,” said Terry Kyle, CEO, CHRISTUS Children’s Foundation. “This gift ensures that every child, regardless of background or circumstance, has access to the highest level of surgical care.”

The upgraded spaces will be part of the Center for Surgical Innovation at CHRISTUS Children’s and will support the only fully accredited ACPA Craniofacial & Cleft Palate Clinic in San Antonio. With this gift, CHRISTUS Children’s moves closer to becoming a destination Center of Excellence, keeping families close to home while delivering world-class care.

CHRISTUS Children’s Opens Comprehensive Neurology Clinic at the MAC

Thanks to a \$1 million gift from the Melissa and John Kauth Foundation, CHRISTUS Children’s has opened a state-of-the-art Comprehensive Clinic at the Multi-Assistance Center (MAC) at Morgan’s Wonderland. The 5,522-square-foot facility brings together pediatric neurology, surgery, therapy and genetics under one roof, streamlining care for children with autism, epilepsy and other complex neurological conditions.



San Antonio now has its first pediatric epilepsy surgery program, led by Drs. Mark Lee, Fred Perkins and Mark McManis. The clinic eliminates the need for multiple appointments across locations, improving access and outcomes for families.

“This clinic is a beacon of hope for thousands of children,” said Dr. Ian Thompson, Jr., president of CHRISTUS Children’s

Foundation. “The Kauth Foundation’s gift is truly transformational.”

With this visionary gift, the Kauth Foundation is not only funding a clinic but also fostering hope, healing and bright futures for countless children and families in San Antonio and beyond.

CHILDREN'S MIRACLE NETWORK HOSPITALS

Generous 10-Year Grant from Panda Express Transforms Pediatric Rehab at CHRISTUS Children's

CHRISTUS Children's and the CHRISTUS Children's Foundation celebrated a transformative 10-year commitment to fund pediatric inpatient rehabilitation thanks to a generous partnership with Panda Express, a leading Children's Miracle Network Hospitals (CMN Hospitals) partner. By the end of 2030, Panda Express aims to raise \$2,093,732 to establish a Panda Cares Center of Hope within the hospital, a healing space designed to support the mental, emotional, physical and spiritual needs of young patients.



"In many cases, a child's life changes in an instant," said Michele Reinarz, director of rehabilitation. "Our inpatient rehab center helps families navigate those changes with compassion and care."



The rehab unit offers access to specialized therapy equipment and play-based treatment methods that make recovery engaging and effective. Thanks to the Panda Cares grant, the space has been remodeled to expand open areas and upgrade equipment, accelerating healing and helping children return to their communities sooner.

Panda Express is one of the fastest-growing CMN Hospitals partners and exemplifies a culture of giving. Co-founders Andrew and Peggy Cherng have instilled a deep sense of stewardship in their company, starting with associate giving before ever asking guests to donate.

This 10-year grant is more than a financial commitment; it's a promise of hope, healing and resilience for every child who walks through the doors at CHRISTUS Children's.



2025 Local Children’s Miracle Network Hospitals Champion, Violet, Supports CHRISTUS Children’s as CowParade Artist

When Violet Gullion was just 12 years old, her life took an unexpected turn. She began losing weight, experiencing mild panic attacks, and her skin lost its color. Concerned, her parents turned to her pediatrician for answers. After multiple rounds of lab work, Violet was diagnosed with moderate anemia and referred to pediatric hematology at CHRISTUS Children’s.

Further testing revealed a rare and complex diagnosis: myeloid-lymphoid neoplasm with eosinophilia (MLN-*eo*). The condition causes bone marrow to produce an excess of eosinophils, a type of white blood cell, due to a genetic rearrangement. MLN-*eo* is exceptionally rare in pediatric patients, especially in females, making Violet’s diagnosis both difficult and unusual. As part of her initial evaluation, doctors also discovered that Violet’s heart had suffered damage due to the condition. She began immunotherapy and heart treatment, and slowly but surely, Violet started to recover.

Today, Violet is a thriving 16-year-old student at Incarnate Word High School. She’s been a patient at CHRISTUS Children’s since 2020 and now serves as the hospital’s 2025 local Children’s Miracle Network Hospitals (CMN Hospitals) champion. In this role, Violet shares her story and advocates for CHRISTUS Children’s across the San Antonio community, attending events and engaging with donors to raise awareness and support.



Violet participated in CowParade 2025, an international public art exhibit that benefits CHRISTUS Children’s. Her painted cow is a vibrant tribute to her favorite album of all time: *Pet Sounds* by The Beach Boys. The cow reflects Violet’s love for music, her creative spirit and her journey of healing and hope.

Violet’s story is a testament to resilience, the power of specialized pediatric care, and the importance of community support. She hopes to one day pursue a career in the medical field to help other patients like herself, turning her experience into a lifelong mission of compassion and care.

Violet's story, along with those shared by patient families reminded everyone of the real impact their contributions make.



The grand finale came with the check presentation: a record-breaking \$510,185 raised, with every dollar directly benefiting CHRISTUS Children's to support life-changing care for patients and families in our community. 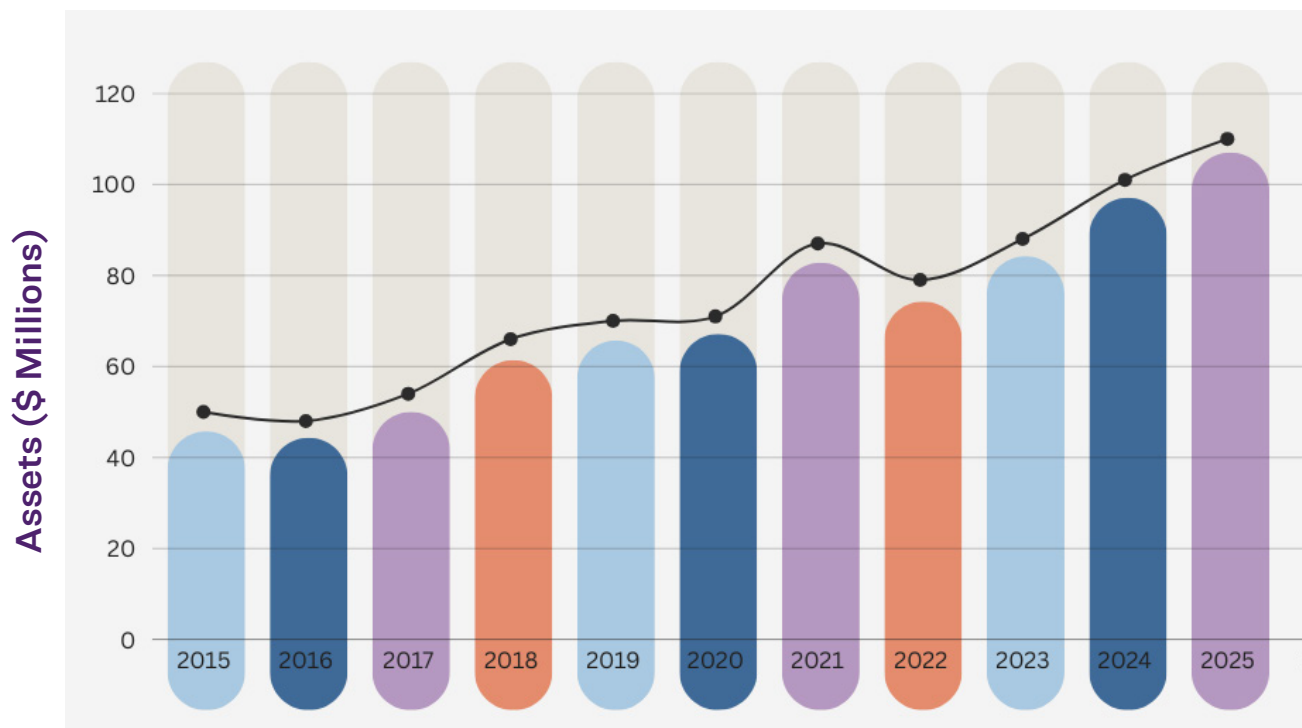
CHRISTUS Children's is a proud member of Children's Miracle Network Hospitals.

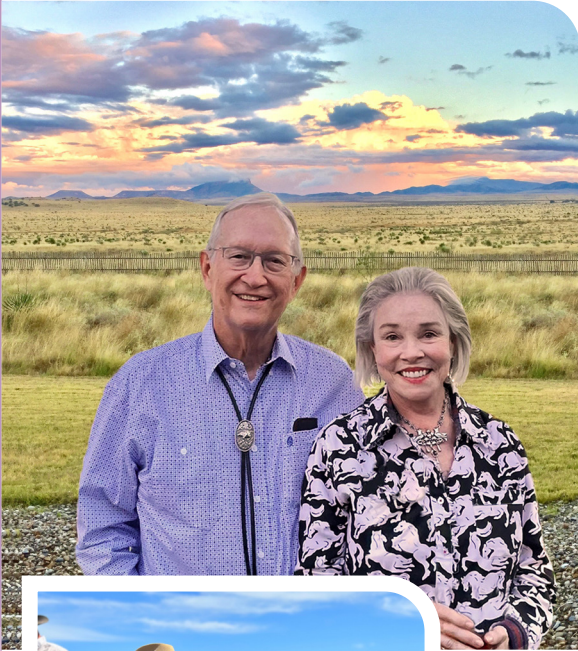

DONOR SPOTLIGHT

Bonnie and John Korbell: A Legacy of Shared Blessings

Deeply rooted in San Antonio, Bonnie and John Korbell have demonstrated decades of service and philanthropy spanning health care, higher education and cultural preservation. The couple recently made a generous \$1.2 million gift that will establish The Bonnie and John Korbell Nephrology Clinic and Dialysis Center on the second floor of the David Christopher Goldsbury Center for Children and Families at CHRISTUS Children's.



Since 2011, the clinic has provided compassionate, expert care to hundreds of children and adolescents living with kidney conditions. The Korbells' gift will help create a more child-friendly and comfortable environment through a complete renovation of the clinic and dialysis center. The gift will fund the replacement of six dialysis machines, installation of a new water treatment system, updated lighting and flooring, refreshed furniture throughout the facility and more. These enhancements will impact the quality of care and significantly enhance the experience for young patients and their families, especially during long sessions.

The Korbells have demonstrated an ongoing commitment to supporting key initiatives at CHRISTUS, including gifts to oncology care and the Pediatric Mobile Clinic.



Bonnie and John have remained deeply engaged in the community, each serving on several nonprofit boards and contributing their time and leadership to causes close to their hearts. John began his philanthropic journey in 1978 when he joined the board of the Cancer Therapy and Research Center (CTRC), later serving as chairman. He has served on the board of Trinity University since 1978, including as chair, and remains actively involved today. Bonnie has long supported girls' and children's causes and has been honored by

The Children's Shelter and Girls, Inc. She also maintains a strong connection with Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, where her grandfather founded the Department of Biochemistry, now named in his honor.
